



Environmental Awareness Fact Sheet

As Wisconsin's No. 1 entertainment destination, Potawatomi Bingo Casino welcomes more than 4 million guests each year. Because of the large number of guests, environmental concerns are of the utmost importance to the Casino and the Forest County Potawatomi, whose beliefs include respecting the earth and all of its resources. For that reason, Potawatomi Bingo Casino continually looks for avenues to reduce its carbon footprint and be as environmentally friendly as possible. Potawatomi Bingo Casino and the Forest County Potawatomi are proud to be stewards of the earth and demonstrate that stewardship in a number of areas including:

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

- Energy performance is constantly being monitored and upgraded.
- Automatic light shut-offs are used in all office areas.
- All slot machines at Potawatomi Bingo Casino use LCD technology in their monitors, which consumes and generates less heat than previous technologies.
- Potawatomi Bingo Casino has converted to a digital Energy Management System. Because of this, the Casino is drawing less energy to maintain adequate temperature and air quality throughout the facility.

WATER USAGE

- Potawatomi Bingo Casino has incorporated regional drainage patterns and storm water management into its design plans.
- Low-flow water fixtures are used throughout the Casino.
- An erosion control plan has been incorporated into the expansion of the Casino.
- The Potawatomi Bingo Casino Administration Building employs the use of no-water urinals in its bathrooms.

RECYCLING

- Used playing cards are recycled through donations to service clubs and other organizations.

Environmental Awareness Facts (cont.)

- Cooking oil from restaurants inside Potawatomi Bingo Casino is picked up by a vendor and recycled into other products – such as soap.
- Housekeeping uses many recycled products – such as toilet paper and environmentally friendly cleaning products.
- Potawatomi Bingo Casino recycles all fluorescent light bulbs, computer equipment and monitors.
- Potawatomi Bingo Casino recycles CFC refrigerants, scrap metals and aluminum.

CONSTRUCTION/BUILDING DESIGN

- During construction of the Casino's \$240 million expansion project, more than 50 percent of the leftover construction materials have been recycled.
- Existing infrastructure is being reused in the expansion and Potawatomi Bingo Casino is maintaining as much excavated material on-site to minimize landfill requirements.
- The 40,000 square-foot Potawatomi Bingo Casino Administration Building, located at the corner of 13th Street and St. Paul Avenue opened in 2002. It incorporates many green components compliant with sustainable design guidelines and features recycled brick and carpeting, high-efficiency lighting fixtures and as much natural lighting as possible.

TRANSPORTATION

- Potawatomi Bingo Casino played a major role in establishing a Milwaukee County bus route along Canal Street to provide an alternative way for guests and team members to access the Casino.
- A bus parking lot and guest waiting area was built as part of the Casino's expansion, encouraging large-group bus tours to visit the facility.
- Bike racks are provided for all team members.
- The newly constructed connector bridge linking the James E. Groppi Unity Bridge to the east-end parking structure has helped reduce traffic congestion in the Menomonee Valley.

OTHER

- Indoor air quality is constantly monitored and tested by an outside vendor.
- Sixty percent of Potawatomi Bingo Casino is designated smoke-free, including all restaurants, a portion of the Nest of Life Bingo Hall and the Sky Lodge gaming area, located next to the Bingo Hall on the second level of the Casino.
- Landscaping on property includes significant plantings to provide as much shade as possible, help with irrigation and deploy oxygen into the air.
- The Casino is converting from paper to reusable plates and utensils in its Employee Dining Room, which provides meals to more than 2,000 team members daily.
